Key Theme

Supremacy and Sufficiency of Christ. Paul opposes the false teaching in the church at Colosse, emphasizing that Christ is the creator and sustainer of all things and the one mediator between God and human beings.

Author

The apostle Paul, probably written from prison in Rome, about AD 60-62.

Recipients

The Church in Colosse

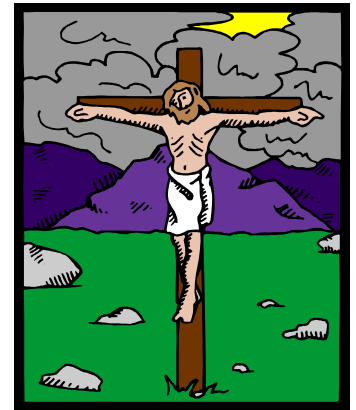
Interesting Facts about Colossians

1. Gnosticism, an early form of which Paul seems to be opposing in Colossians, would become the greatest religious threat to Christianity in the second century.
2. Colossians was sent with the letter to Philemon, and perhaps also with Ephesians.
3. Ephesians is closely related to Colossians in theme and style. While Colossians stresses Christ as the head of the church, Ephesians emphasizes the church as the body of Christ.

The Church at Colosse

The Colossian church appears to have been established by Epaphras, a native of Colosse and one of Paul's companions (1:7; 4:12; Philemon 23).
