Key Themes

- I. Encouragement for Maturity. Paul thanks God for the Thessalonians faith and encourages them to continue endurance in the face of persecution. (1:3-12; 2:13-3:5).
- 2. Correction of Misconceptions. Paul seeks to comfort and correct the Thessalonians about their misconceptions concerning the day of the Lord (2:1-17).
 - 3. Accountability. Paul calls into account those who refuse to work and act like busybodies (3:6-15).

The apostle Paul, written from Corinth about AD 51.

Summary Statement

The two Thessalonian letters contain more teaching about the study of the end times and the return of Christ than any other part of the New Testament.
